CODE OF CONDUCT FOR SKIERS/SNOWBOARDERS

Adaptive Snowsports Aldershot (“ASA”) is a registered community amateur sports club affiliated to Snowsport England which provides opportunities for disabled people of all ages to ski or snowboard. This code of conduct has been adapted from an SSE resource.

- ❄ As a member of ASA and participant in snowsports activities and competitions I agree to abide by the code of conduct provided below:
 - I will show respect to instructors, guides and helpers at all times.
- ❄ I will respect volunteers and officials involved in snowsports and I understand that my participation and that of other skiers and snowboarders is only possible because of the time freely given by those volunteers to help me and others.
- ❄ I will show respect to all other members of ASA, their families, to my team and other participants.
- ❄ I understand that ASA is about making everyone feel welcome and involved and about fully inclusive snowsports. I will not take part in any bullying or any activity that could be construed as bullying. If I am worried about bullying I will talk to my family and a member of the ASA Committee.
- ❄ I will act in a manner at all times that does not bring myself, my sport or ASA into disrepute during races, training and ASA sessions. I will keep in mind that I represent ASA and all that it stands for when I am involved in snowsports activities.
- ❄ I understand that disciplinary action may be taken against me for breach of rules or for reasons of behaviour. The type of action taken will depend on the nature and seriousness of my actions/ breach of these rules and may include a verbal or written warning.
